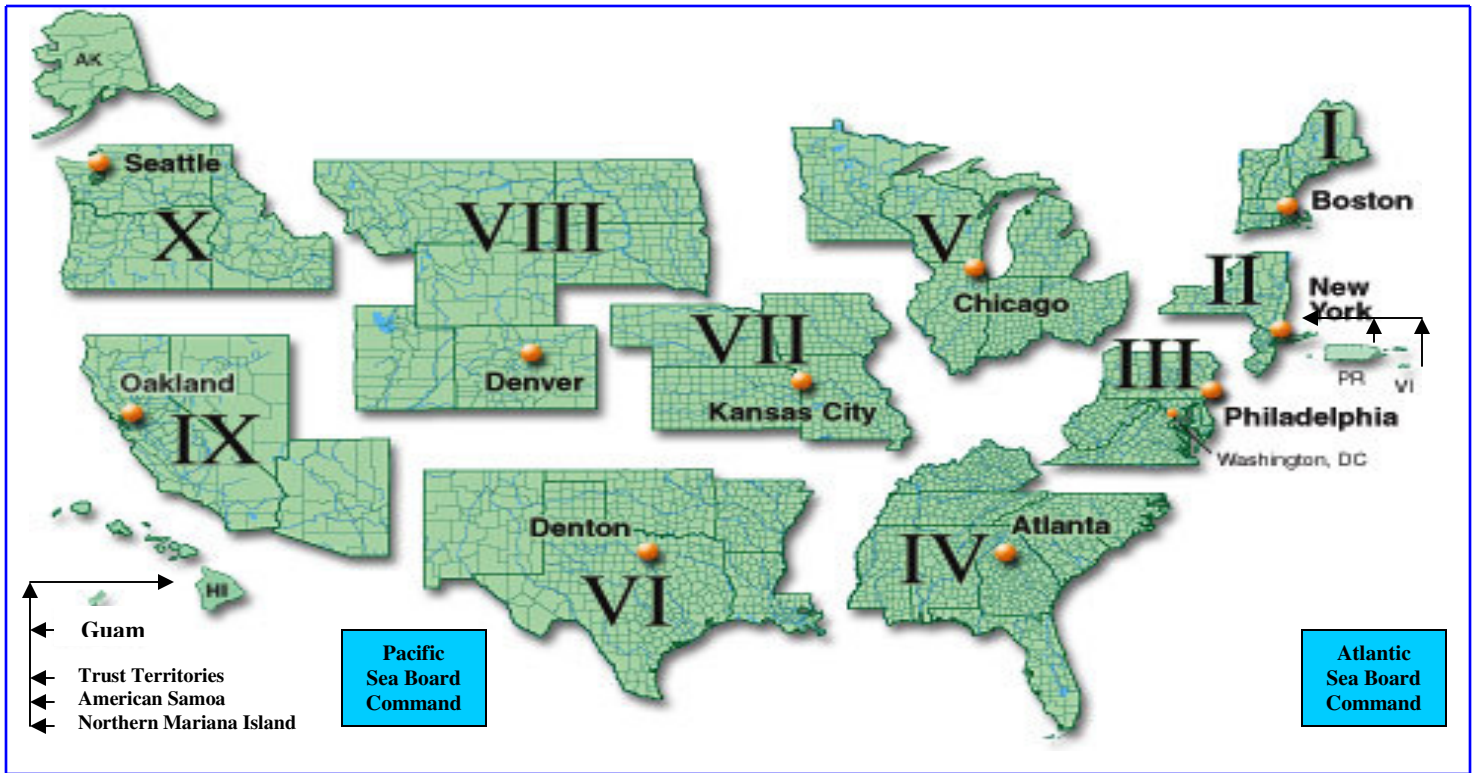

Arriving at the Main Headquarters

Our Command Control Center is located at Governor's Mobile Tactical Command, Incorporated Headquarters in the state of Tennessee, Region IV. When you approach our main entrance you will drive through two red and black iron gates with gold leaf trim prior to reaching the main guard station. Our flash photography system will take pictures of the driver, any passenger's, license plate and a mirror image of the vehicle undercarriage.

The cluster of photographs are reviewed then downloaded to our national data base before you reach the guard station. Our security personnel will know who the car is registered to then all of the information is transferred to our secondary location in the lobby.

We are in the process of hiring five drugs, chemical and explosive sniffing dogs. There will be five additional dogs that will be able to sniff for victims trapped under rubble. All of our dogs will rotate around on the property one will be housed at the main gate and the other is in the lobby.

Once you had been cleared at our first check point you will proceed to a designed parking lot that is about a quarter of a mile away from our building. Our security director has advised us to minimize any threat from a vehicle.

Once you park in the designated parking lot, one of our fire engines will pick you up and bring you to the front door of our building. The design of the fire engine is unique for our guests to ride in however there is a high level metal detector built inside the door frame. If an alarm sounds, we will ask the guest to return and place the metal object back in their automobile before proceeding forward. All other guests who have metal in or around themselves are subject to being sniffed by our weapons dog.

While looking up to our building you will experience a breath taking view of all fifty states and five U. S. Territorial flags displayed on opposite sides of the roadway as you ascend to the front doors. During a slight breeze the states and territorial flags will be waving their colors. During your trip to the main gate you will hear patriotic songs from the Freedom Archway Circle.

There are 111 patriotic songs produced to date. Each song lasts an average of 3 minutes and 35 seconds. Over a period of eight hours each song will be played one time.

Under each flag pole there will be flowers of purple majesties; red, white and blue carnations and amber waves of grain. Our team of foliage experts suggested the state flower should be planted under each state flag or territorial flag. We will try to accommodate their wishes if the climate in Tennessee cooperates. Lights will illuminate each flag during night fall. The flags will be secured only during incimate conditions beyond the scope of normal.

The flags will fly at full staff 24/7 and when the state of Emergency has been declared for us to respond we will lower that state flag during our deployment.

Once you enter the lobby you will be greeted by additional security personnel and one of our drug and weapon sniffing dogs, you are asked to provide a thumb print that registers you as a guest. This process is two fold.

The first process is to know who is in our building. The second process is if our guest becomes sick or injured the information contained in their Red, White and Blue Identification Badge will be downloaded to our hand held wireless printer.

The printed material will be handed to our transporting in-house paramedic response team. The information contained on the printed document is confidential and gives us a base line for who we are treating and emergency contact information.

The Red, White and Blue G.P.S. monitoring I.D. badge will be worn by all visitors during the duration of their stay. Once they leave the building they will be required to return and swipe their identification badge to our security personnel all information and data collected will be erased.

Construction of Our Building

The bottom sub-basement floor of our building will have six inches of concrete. The base of the foundation will tie into and support the steel exterior I-beams. All of our interior and exterior walls will become part of the foundation as a solid pour structure. The height of the first sub-basement floor will be 15 feet high.

The second sub-basement floor foundation will be solid piece of multiple concrete rebar construction that wraps around each supporting beam, columns, girders and the floor beams which will become a solid steel/concrete construction. This process will tie in the outside walls to the main structure making the structure one solid tight building. The height of the second sub-basement floor will be 24 feet high.

The third, fourth and fifth floors will have two inches thick concrete floor support the walls are four inches of cinder block all corners and inside support columns will be a solid concrete poured walls. The height of the third, fourth and fifth floor will be 10 feet high.

All heating, cooling and ventilation system will have air ducts under each floor.

Due to the complexity of the building and how it is spread outward underground, each floor will have its own HVAC unit. The elevators and utility shafts are solid masonry pored structure and will have four inch fire proof brick around the elevator shafts.

The four stairways are designed to allow our employees leave any floor, enter a stairway which will have positive pressure ventilation from a sophisticated blower system that will also run on back up generator.

As soon as a fire alarm single or pulls station becomes activated. The stairways become vented by activating blowers through the top of the stairwell. Any smoke or fire will be driven out and up by the thermal column effect of fire suppression and smoke pathways.

When you reach the lobby floor of our five story red brick building, you will only see three floors above the ground.

The windows throughout the building are double pane insulated lexan. The red metal roof will be reinforced by lexan glass a sky light that extends over the atrium area.

Before you enter the building you can walk down to the southeast garden gazebo viewing platform that has a breath taking view of the Tennessee Valley, the Tennessee River, and in the background is the Great Smokey Mountain's.

Once you reach the two large mahogany wooden doors you will enter our atrium where you are greeted by our security personnel. Inside the frame of our entrance door is a hidden high level metal detector.

The American Eagle Freedom Fountain stands in the middle of the lobby. The marble floors are earth tone in color with gold trim. The American Eagle Freedom Fountain sits in front of the glass etching Logo of Governor's Mobile Tactical Command that hangs just below the stairway arch.

Upon entering our building you are greeted by the soft sound of running water from our fountain and waterfall accompanied by music. The American Eagle Freedom Fountain supports our Children's Dream Wish Foundation.

Throughout the lobby there will be several murals displaying our American Hero's Emphasizing 911, saluting our American Armed Forces and our Public Servants who make our country safe and strong.

On each side of the fountain there are two conference style classrooms that can accommodate up to 25 people each.

The restrooms are located on the main floor beyond the conference rooms. The men's and women's restrooms will have a separate sitting area, shower facilities and a locker room.

The men's restroom is on the left side of the lobby. The women's restroom is on the right side of the lobby.

For your comfort and convenience there will be an attendant in our Concierge Room. A separate family room with a handicapped-equipped restroom is provided for those needing assistance.

To accommodate our nursing mothers there will be a private room for relaxation and a baby changing facility in the women's restroom. In the men's restrooms there will be a private area for relaxation and a baby changing facility.

Behind the wall of the glass etched logo of Governor's Mobile Tactical Command is our Concierge Room and where the laundry shoot is located. The employee's clean laundry will be delivered each evening to the Concierge Room.

The laundry shoot works independently from the laundry shoot that is in the C.C.C. however both laundry shoots end up descending down to the second floor sub-basement where our commercial laundry rooms are located.

When you walk out of the men's restroom and turn left, our in-house copy center and shipping area is across the hall from the Concierge Room.

When you walk out of the women's restroom and turn right our in-house copy center and shipping area is across the hall from the Concierge Room.

Behind the copy center on the main floor is the kitchen and sitting area where snacks and drinks will be served throughout the day. During any conferences or meetings the kitchen closes the doors that face the lobby and opens the double glass slider windows that face the conferences room. All drinks and snacks are transferred to the mezzanine floor.

There are two secured wooden doors at the end of each hallway. Behind these double wooden doors is a large conference room with wood floors and a stage on the left side that will accommodate any speaker or band. The conference room will be able to hold up to 200 people.

There are a series of doors that are on the opposite side of the conference room that leads outside onto our deck and in to our east garden and the south end doors open into another garden area which is our south garden.

The kitchen has large double glass slider windows that open out into the conference room which will serve guests. The kitchen serving area will receive food from Nicole's Kitchen which is outside the main building.

The food is transported through a series of large walkways where golf carts can transfer food and support items to the kitchen serving facility on the main lobby floor. All support items and food will be sent upstairs through two dumb waiters.

When you enter our building, security personnel will direct you to our receptionist who is located on the mezzanine floor. As you stand looking at the beautiful American Eagle Freedom Fountain it sits between two wide half spiral stair cases. When you reach the tenth stair the two stairs wrap around the back of the American Eagle Freedom Fountain.

1. The first meeting is in **Orlando, Florida on July 21 – 22, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will create a task force of experts to form a round table. The maximum number of experts from each state should not exceed two.

We will identify the impact of having Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters established in each region and will generate over **118 new jobs**

2. The second meeting is in **Atlanta, Georgia on August 25 – 26, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will have the necessary information to establish specific commands for each region and their location.

We will identify the topography and address special needs and how our equipment will be able to be shuttled by land, sea or air to the affective area of ground zero

3. The third meeting is in **Saint Louis Missouri, on September 22 and 23, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will finalize a list of all special equipment needed for each specific region.

The direction and scope of establishing Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters will be better identified and defined by the fourth meeting

4. The fourth meeting – is in **Washington D.C, on October 20 and 21, 2007**. We will invite specific Associations, Organizations, Special interested parties and private groups to help offset the cost of networking and to establish the first **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters**.

If each state pays their initial share by the fourth meeting and we generate **\$25,000,000.00** in donations from the private sector each state will only pay ONE MILLION DOLLARS THE NEXT YEAR (if the donation from the private sector continues). If we receive more donations then originally pledged, the states will off set-the cost difference the following years! By acting today, the first completed **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Units** could be on-line by mid spring of 2008.
