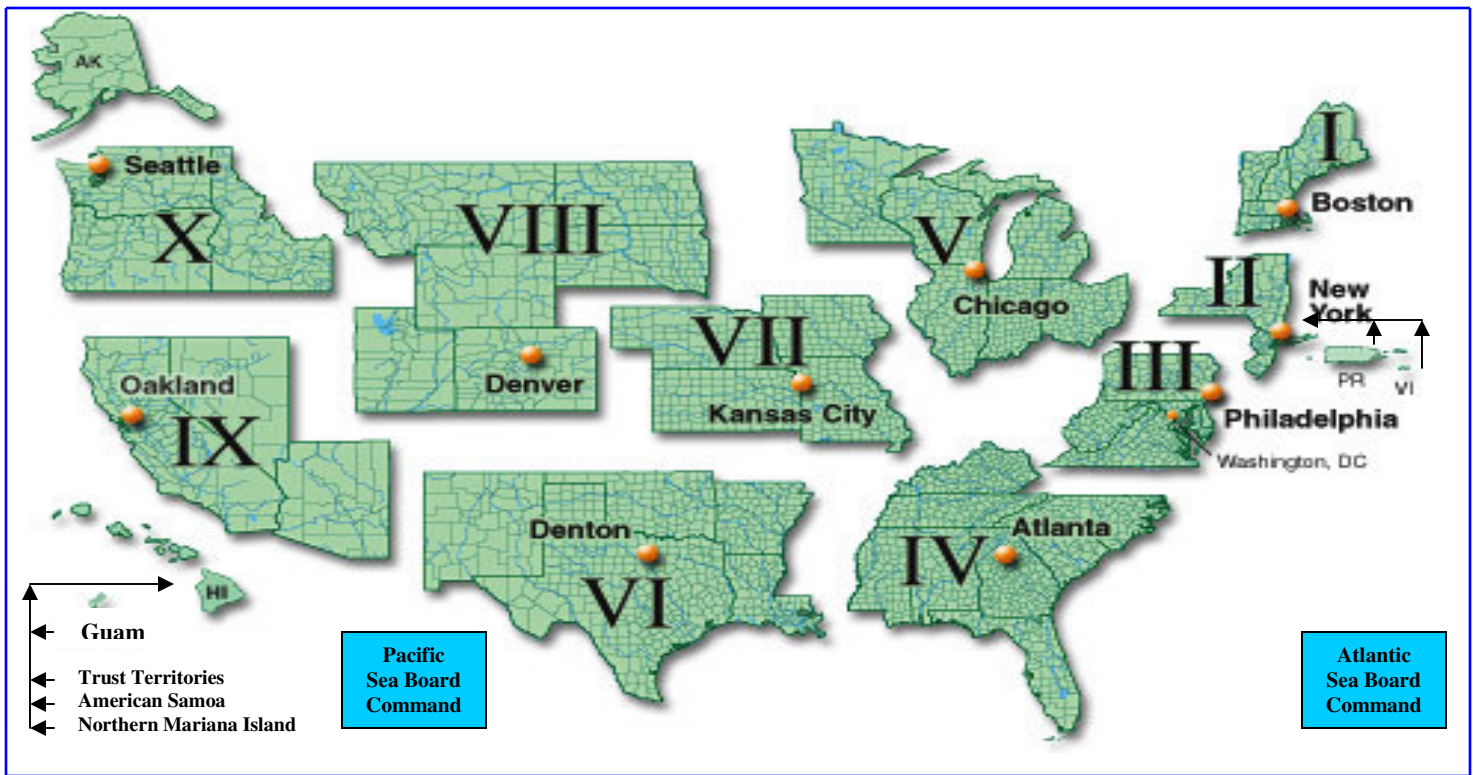

Arriving at the Main Headquarters (con't)

You can stand behind the American Eagle Freedom Fountain and look down into the lobby or you can proceed up to our receptionist who sits behind a replica fire engine desk on the mezzanine floor. There is a glass elevator available to reach our receptionist area from the south side garden area. While waiting for our employee to arrive, the visitor will be able to listen to soft music and the spray of water that forms to the harmony of a song. The fountain water jets and waterfall will be inspired by music.

There are four banks of elevators throughout the building. The only way the lobby elevator opens is with an employee's secured Red, White and Blue Identification card. All visitors will be escorted through the building by an employee. There are three levels of accessibility (Red, White and Blue). Each employee and visitor will wear a Red, White and Blue Identification card that has a built in tone singling device. If the employee is in an unapproved location their Red, White and Blue Identification card will activate the alarm in the security room. All elevator systems are monitored as well as staircases.

The outside exit stair cases are monitored for clean air, smoke and fire. In the quest for safety, we have our own in-house paramedic team of professionals. Our security team and our in-house medical team will respond to any persons that collapse on our facility. There are seven A.E.D.'s on property and 15 A.E.D.'s assigned to our units that are deployed. Our Paramedic transporting unit will secure the scene, treat the patient and transport the patient to the area hospital. If our Helicopter is needed for transport then the patient and team will transport the patient by air to the closest hospital facility or trauma center. The team members will respond to the injured party and will carry an A.E.D. with them to the scene. We will comply with O.S.H.A., standards and all investigation associated with injuries or building failure collapse. Additional Fire and EMS Protocols will be followed.

Director of the Control Command Center Northwest Corner

The director of operations for the C.C.C. is established in an office in the Northwest corner of the building. He has a direct link to all communications with the responding directors, Subject Matter Experts, unit leaders, fleet operation control room Director, Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters at ground zero and the National Hazardous Response teams. The director has control of the communication dialog from our servers, satellite communication network, web site hosting coordinators, and all support directors at the C.C.C.

The Director has links to the Governor's EOC, local, state and Federal Commands and to the President of the United States. The director monitors media relations through our Public Relations Director. The director also relates information to Nicole's Kitchen at the C.C.C. and all communication between Nicole's Kitchen and the Kitchen Field Command's (KFC).

The director receives all the field reports daily. His staff of 12 has full control of all responding personnel to include the information network, G.P.S., V.P.N. and black box reports from our field units which are downloaded every night.

The director is in communication with the communities 911 and reverse 911 systems from the affected area. If the communication network at ground zero is down, the communication network at the C.C.C. can work with the local telephone service provider and have the system rerouted to the 911 operators at the C.C.C. If the communication towers are down, G. M. T. C Headquarters will be able to establish field communication with local commands to get emergency personnel and equipment to site.

If we need to bring any 911 personnel to the C.C.C. we will accommodate that request at that time.

The director will summarize the events of each day and filter that information to the administrator. Additional and classified assignments are also attached to his job description. The director of the C.C.C. is a Subject Matter Expert as well and has over 25 years experience in field operation.

His staff will be assigned to the C.C.C. for 24 hours and will be in full operation until the Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters at ground zero is released by the governor who declared the state of Emergency. Our preliminary report will be forwarded to the Governor's office within five months after the state of Emergency has been rescinded.

Once our quality assurance team receives comments back from the Governor's office addressing additional comments, problems, and concerns we encountered during the state of Emergency, the summary and final report will be sent to the Governor who declared the state of Emergency and to the President of The United States.

All correspondence will be confidential and is exempt from public publication until the final approval is obtained from the Governor's office and the President of the United States.

Once the report is finalized, all Homeland and National Security information as well as classified information will be removed from publication. The publication will be printed and released to the public from K.A.R.E. Printing and Publishing Company.

Weather monitoring room Northeast Corner

The north side corner will house the weather station and the Director. This unique setup will monitor the current weather conditions and problems at our location as well as for responding units and ground zero locations.

Media Room Southeast Corner

The southwest corner will contain the media room and the Director of Media Relations. There will be five different and unique setups to include the diverse backdrops of ABC, NBC, CBS, Fox or independent or foreign communication network.

The media feed will have two different camera's pointing into the communication center; however their will be no audio. Each cubical will have two chairs, a camera, teleprompter and playback screen in the desk for review by the newscaster.

The room will be opened with sound proof capabilities. Each truck will be housed outside our south side wing. Our media support room is below the media room as the camera feed will be fed to the support room downstairs then to the transmitting trucks outside the building.

The Mezzanine

Due to heigten security around our facility during a deployment, the day to day operations continue. The Director of the C.C.C. the weather, media and communication directors each have a private room above their office. The room has a shower, bathroom and Murphy bed that pulls out from the wall. The study area in their room over looks the communication nerve center.

The mezzanine area has four classrooms, separate sleeping quarters for men and women as well as bathrooms, showers and sitting areas. Each common style sleeping quarters is design to have a semi-private room where four foot high walls separate each Murphy bed. On one side of the Murphy bed are three individual lockers; on the other side is a desk-style computer stand. All laundry will be done on a day-to-day basis and will be returned to the director's liaison officer.

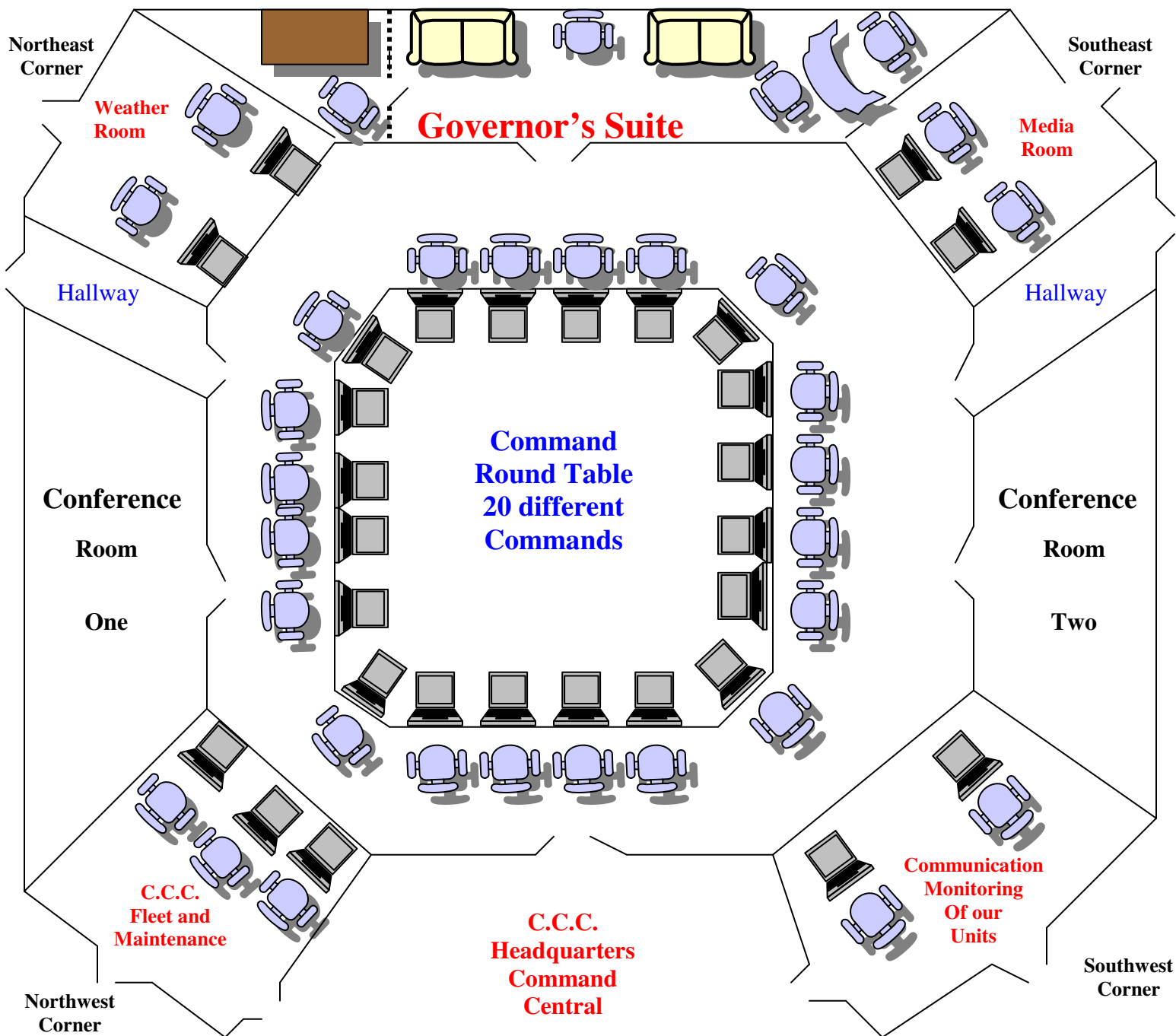
Each member who is off the main floor can go to his assigned location and utilize the computer. However, the computer network monitors all e-mails and web site locations and records and notifies the director of the C.C.C. if any employee in the building visits any inappropriate websites. Regardless of the employees position, they will be immediately removed from their location, escorted outside the building, issued a no transport warning and will be terminated immediately while forfeiting any benefits due them. Their check and all personal items will be mailed to them.

Each employee that is assigned to the C.C.C. will be issued linens, pillows, and blankets. When the employee is on break or off for a period of time they can go to the recreational center or to Nicole's Restaurant. Any employee who is assigned to the C.C.C. on a 24 hour basis can have outside family members visit. Any outside visitor can visit the C.C.C. and enter the secured room.

The visitor can look down onto the C.C.C. main control floor through the four inch thick plastic lexan glass. This protects the C.C.C. main floor computers. Any member who leaves or enters the room will swipe their Red, White and Blue Hologram G.P.S. monitor Identification card. If the employee is away from their position and we need the employee back we will activate there I.D. card which vibrates.

Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Round Table

We will identify Governor's Mobile Tactical Command

1. The first meeting is in **Orlando, Florida on July 21 – 22, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will create a task force of experts to form a round table. The maximum number of experts from each state should not exceed two.

We will identify the impact of having Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters established in each region and will generate over **118 new jobs**

2. The second meeting is in **Atlanta, Georgia on August 25 – 26, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will have the necessary information to establish specific commands for each region and their location.

We will identify the topography and address special needs and how our equipment will be able to be shuttled by land, sea or air to the affective area of ground zero

3. The third meeting is in **Saint Louis Missouri, on September 22 and 23, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will finalize a list of all special equipment needed for each specific region.

The direction and scope of establishing Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters will be better identified and defined by the fourth meeting

4. The fourth meeting – is in **Washington D.C, on October 20 and 21, 2007**. We will invite specific Associations, Organizations, Special interested parties and private groups to help offset the cost of networking and to establish the first **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters**.

If each state pays their initial share by the fourth meeting and we generate **\$25,000,000.00** in donations from the private sector each state will only pay ONE MILLION DOLLARS THE NEXT YEAR (if the donation from the private sector continues). If we receive more donations then originally pledged, the states will off set-the cost difference the following years! By acting today, the first completed **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Units** could be on-line by mid spring of 2008.
