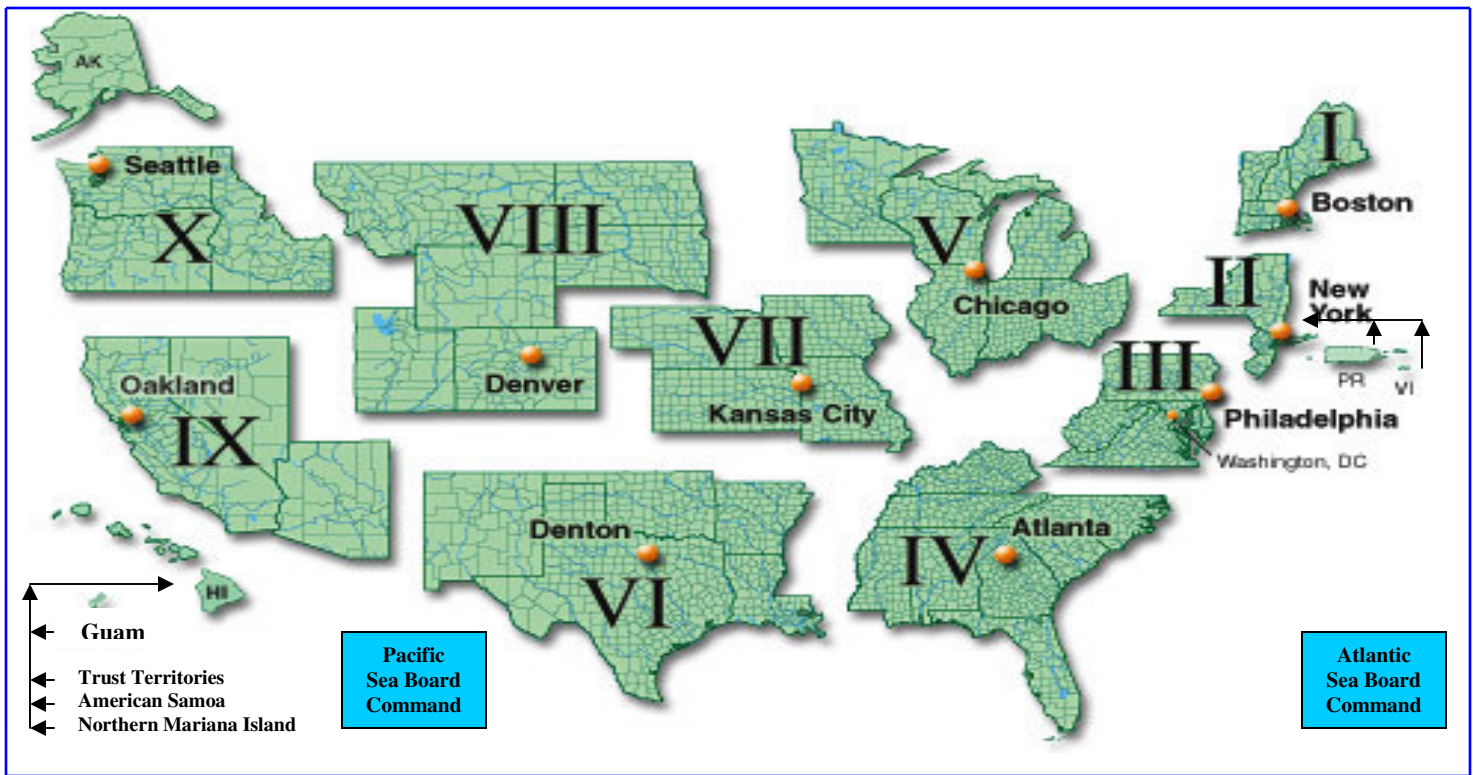

How our Staging Requirements work hand in hand with G.M.T.C.

Our staging requirements are straight forward! There will be 2 – 2,500 gallon diesel tanks and one 1,000 gallon unleaded tank for refueling purposes. If we need to refill our fuel tanks daily, one of the fuel companies will have the contract. These tanks are transported empty then filled at staging for command and outside responding agencies. Fire, Police, Utilities, Military and other support equipment. These tanks are separate from **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters.**

Governor's Mobile Tactical Command provides staging officers who are in contact with Governor's Command at all times. Governor's Command will advise our staging officers of needed equipment and manpower in a given area. The Staging Officer will notify Governor's Command of the units and team personnel sent into ground zero. Governor's Command will send the names and team units to the Sector Commanders who will be waiting for the arrival of the staging personnel. Once the members are at Sector Command, they will notify **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters** to up-date the command board system. This will inform our leaders that all members have arrived and are officially assigned to specific Sector Commands.

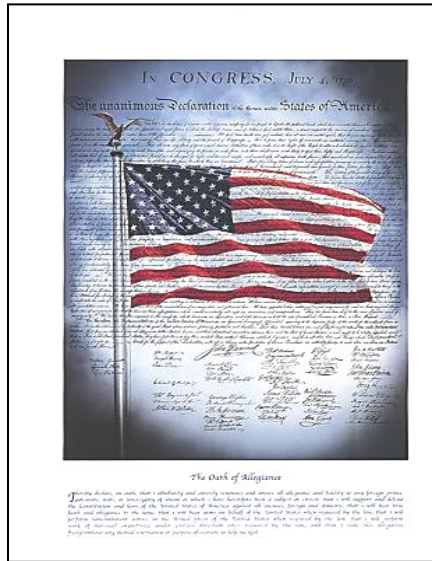

Once the Sector Command is finished with the equipment and personnel, the information will be sent back to Governor's Command who will notify Staging Command so they can wait for the arrival of the team. The command system automatically updates without verbal response. This allows for a true tracking system within the arena. All personnel will be required to sign in and obtain a Governor's Command G.P.S. Identification card and a G.P.S. Bumper Sticker for monitoring purposes. Each staging area will have the following;

1. Hot and cold food available from Kitchen Command
2. Separate bathroom facilities for men and women
3. Separate showers for men and women
4. Laundry Mat Unit – This unit will be maintained by in-house laundry staff
5. Large air condition/heat sleeping tents will be provided by a third party company

These units are managed by the governor during a HOMELAND Security Breach and/or by a Natural Disaster.

These units are managed by the United States President when the national alerting system reaches **RED**.



We have a mobile surgical/dental unit with our own A.L.S. transport helicopter.

We can utilize the equipment at any national convention or government private dignitary functions.

Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters will have a tent city in and around the staging areas which we will be able to hold and feed maximum of 300 first responders and support personnel per day. These tents and units are unique in design and will be provided by a third party company. Each unit is air conditioned and heat controlled. The option of having a cot or a sleeping bag will be up to the first responders. There are sleeping quarters, bathrooms and shower facilities for men and women in and around staging facilities.

During any movement of personnel in or around ground zero we will be able to monitor all audio and video feeds from our units, all radio communications and we have the capabilities of establishing their location by using the GPS Bumper Sticker and their R/W/B Hologram Identification card. All movements are registered in their black box and downloaded every thirty minutes or until they return to staging. Each component of the vehicles movement and communication is monitored and maintained by our fleet director at the Central Command Control (CCC). If and when a team is deployed from staging we will be able to locate them within minute. This gives us the opportunity to advise GMTC or its sectors their location and estimate time of arrival at sector commands inside ground zero.

Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters has the availability to sleep 40 commanding officers inside the command post. We are unique in design and mobile. Each Nicole's Field Command Kitchen (KFC) can maintain and feed 300 emergency responders per day. If we need additional mobile KFC's at or around Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters we will provide them within a day or two after arriving at ground zero. If we had to deploy all of our KFC's we will be able to serve a minimum of 2000 emergency workers' per day.

What we bring to Ground zero

Please understand this only describes the surface of equipment

- 30 - C-8500's – Each vehicle holds up to four responders
- 4 - Semi tractors
- 2 - Tandem Surgical buses
- 2 - Command Supervisor Units
- 2 - Single driving Satellite vehicles
- 40** - Unique and different functional units

- 8 - Communication Center 53 foot trailers. These trailers expand to 14 feet wide by 53 feet long
- 2 - Kitchen Field Commands on a 53' trailer expand to 14 feet wide by 53 feet long
- 3 - Smaller KFC food Depot transported to ground zero – 1 - 53 foot trailer
- 2 - Washer and Dryer Trailers 53 foot trailers expand to 14 feet wide by 53 feet long
- 2 - 1000 Kw independent electrical units 2 - on a 53 foot trailers
- 1 - 500 Kw independent electrical units 3 - on a 53 foot trailer
- 2 - Independent Surgical/Dental – EMS Command unit (2) mobile surgical buses
- 1 - Recreational center on a 53 foot trailer expand to 14 feet wide by 53 feet long
- 7 - 53 'foot trailers independently operating on their own – All the support equipment is transport
- 38** on 8 different mobile trailers expand to 14 feet wide by 53 feet long

To operate and run Governor Mobile Tactical Command at ground zero we initially will need 78 employees. After the first week most of our employees will be sent back home and replaced by local emergency responders, command experts from their communities and other volunteers. If this does not occur we will be able to sustain G.M.T.C. for one month. Our deployment is based on the Governor declaring a state of emergency.

Our helicopter and pilots are ready to respond. They are assigned to the helicopter unit which is unique in design. Once we arrive at our last check point one-hour and thirty minutes away from ground zero. All our units are refilled at this time, our personnel are feed, and they are debriefed by our commanders. Our helicopter is deployed at that time. Nearly 11,000 gallons of diesel, unleaded gasoline and jet fuel will be transferred in to our tanks.

During this deployment our helicopter pilot will start videoing and downloading his findings to our Central Command Center who will forward them to the commanders at ground zero and to the state EOC Headquarters. Once G.M.T.C. is established at ground zero all the videos will be transferred to our secure website. Any Executive Branch Leader, Governor, Local state and Federal Agencies including our Subject Matter Experts will be able to sign in to our secure website and see first hand the devastation in and around ground zero. We have an extensive lighting system and computer back up generators. The advancement of our command systems and the over all state of the art computer technology we have in place gives us the cutting edge tools we need to help local, state and Federal agencies with the communication need of today!

Creating the Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Round Table

We will identify Governor's Mobile Tactical Command

1. The first meeting is in **Orlando, Florida on July 21 – 22, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will create a task force of experts to form a round table. The maximum number of experts from each state should not exceed two.

We will identify the impact of having Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters established in each region and will generate over **118 new jobs**

2. The second meeting is in **Atlanta, Georgia on August 25 – 26, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will have the necessary information to establish specific commands for each region and their location.

We will identify the topography and address special needs and how our equipment will be able to be shuttled by land, sea or air to the affective area of ground zero

3. The third meeting is in **Saint Louis Missouri, on September 22 and 23, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will finalize a list of all special equipment needed for each specific region.

The direction and scope of establishing Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters will be better identified and defined by the fourth meeting

4. The fourth meeting – is in **Washington D.C, on October 20 and 21, 2007**. We will invite specific Associations, Organizations, Special interested parties and private groups to help offset the cost of networking and to establish the first **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters**.

If each state pays their initial share by the fourth meeting and we generate **\$25,000,000.00** in donations from the private sector each state will only pay ONE MILLION DOLLARS THE NEXT YEAR (if the donation from the private sector continues). If we receive more donations then originally pledged, the states will off set-the cost difference the following years! By acting today, the first completed **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Units** could be on-line by mid spring of 2008.
