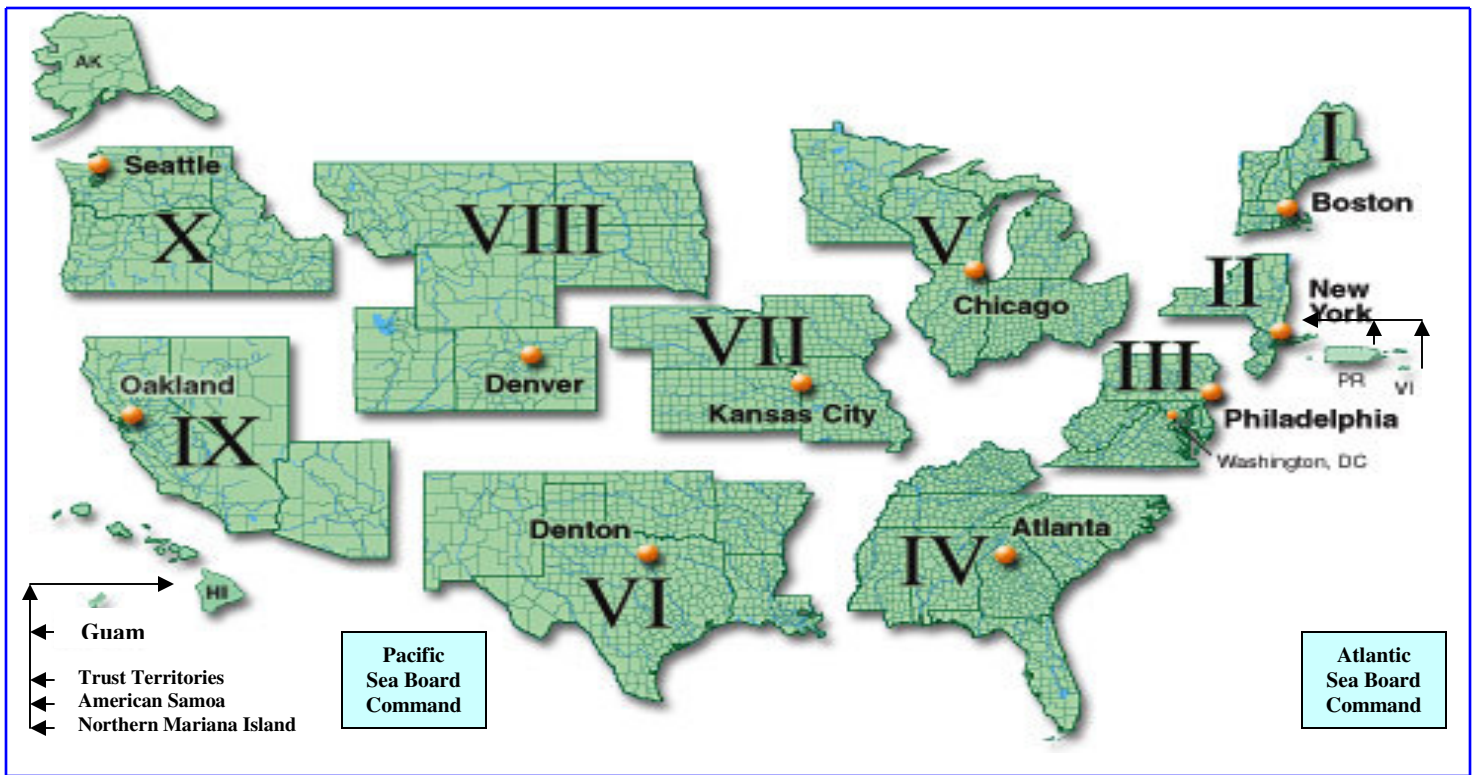


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Donations to G. M. T. C.

All donations are accepted in a form of a cashier's check, personal check, money order or any other certified funds. All donations should be made out to Governor's Mobile Tactical Command, Inc., care of Purchasing Power. This program is unique. On behalf of the children, schools and community ventures, corporations or family member projects can send in donations or go on-line and pick a piece of equipment that they want to have their name attached to.

Each piece of equipment that is donated for operational needs through this fund will be identified as follows:

- A. You can pick any piece of equipment you want to donate to the cause and have your name attached.
- B. An explanation and justification of the item purchased will be explained in a letter. However your donation might have multiple people attached to the same item purchased.

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- C. All or portion of your donation is used to purchase the piece of equipment shown in the picture. Your donation could be large enough where two or more items can be purchased at once.
However your donation might have multiple people attached to the same item purchased.
- D. Your donation for that piece of equipment will be listed on our web page under donated equipment. You can show your friends which piece of equipment you helped purchase. The purchase of that piece of equipment might save a life.
Every time your donated equipment is used in a life saving attempt, you will receive a "Save a Life Award" and an explanation of how and why that piece of equipment was used during an emergency. (Great for show and tell)
- E. Every time the unit is removed from permanent service you will be notified.
- F. All your donated hard earned money will be utilized on the purchase of that item except 10 percent. Let me explain why! We are removing 10 percent from all donations and place them in a single line item budget fund.
- G. We will buy additional service warranties and accessories not all items will we be able to justify a service warranty or would require accessories. This fund shall grow large enough and eventually be self sustaining. The 10 percent will be given back to the purchasing department where all the donations of 100 percent will be donated to buying a piece of equipment.

How this concept came about

A True Story

I would like to share with you a true story that happened to me. On November 22, 1975, I started my career as a professional firefighter. I was part of a combination volunteer and paid firefighting organization. We had a very limited budget and a group of Captains and senior firefighters asked the Fire Chief if the department could purchase the Hurst Jaws of Life® tools and accessories. The Jaws of Life is a 32-inch scissor-like spreader that opens and closes to force crushed metal away from trapped victims. The Chief advised them that the budget did not have the funds necessary to purchase the life saving tools or accessories. He told the men to think outside the box and be creative.

During the next board meeting, the Captains and senior firefighters suggested that we, as a group, should try to raise money for the "**Jaws of Life**" ® and start a campaign. The approval from our Fire Commissioners and Fire Chief were granted.

Letters were written and sent out explaining our objectives. They went to Publix Super Markets of Florida, S. and H. Green Stamp Corporation and the Hurst, Jaws of Life® Corporation. (1976)

During the next few weeks the fire district received the following approvals:

The first approval came from Publix Super Markets of Florida, one of largest grocery store chains in the Southeast. They agreed to support our campaign how ever long the process took, until our goal was reached.

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The second approval came from S. and H. Green Stamps, Inc. to allow us to convert the S. and H. Green Stamps into cash. The catch was the stamps had to be licked until each page was filled.

(Thousands of S. and H. Green Stamps books were assembled and guess who had to lick all those stamps? You got it, the firefighters during the rest of the week had the honors to lick and stick thousands of those little green stamps to make a book.)

The third approval came from the Hurst, "Jaws of Life"® Campaign.

The city was Tampa; the township was Town-n-County. We collected and licked thousands of S. and H. Green Stamps to make our dream a reality. Publix Super Markets of Florida chain was closed on Sunday in those days so all our donations had to be obtained on Saturday. The S. and H. Green Stamps were issued to the customer when groceries were purchased.

On Saturday morning, everyone in the community seemed to shop at Publix Super Markets of Florida. The support of our community and Publix Super Markets of Florida helped make our goal a reality. The only draw back was that we were still in service and if an alarm sounded we left, handled the emergency, and came back to Publix Super Markets of Florida until the end of the day. We collected S. and H. Green Stamps for at least a year and half.

Then the community was invited for the unveiling to see how the Hurst Jaws of Life® really worked and how this single tool would make it easier to reach injured patients trapped inside an automobile. Corporate instructors flew to our city and gave each firefighter lessons on how to use the Hurst Jaws of Life®.

Later that afternoon, we headed over to a local junk yard where officials from around the community and those who donated came and watched us train; and train we did. We removed hundreds of metal doors, flapped roofs and learned how to stabilize a vehicle.

As a professional firefighter for over 31 years, I have personally used this tool in countless auto accidents, shoring up portions of collapsed buildings, stabilized semi's and automobiles that were on their sides and countless other reasons. I would personally like to thank our community, Publix Super Markets of Florida, S. and H. Green Stamps Corporation and the Hurst "Jaws of Life"® Corporation. Their dedication over the past four decades had made my job easier. Their tools have made all the firefighter's jobs around the world a bit easier and the reward of saving a life is our objective. 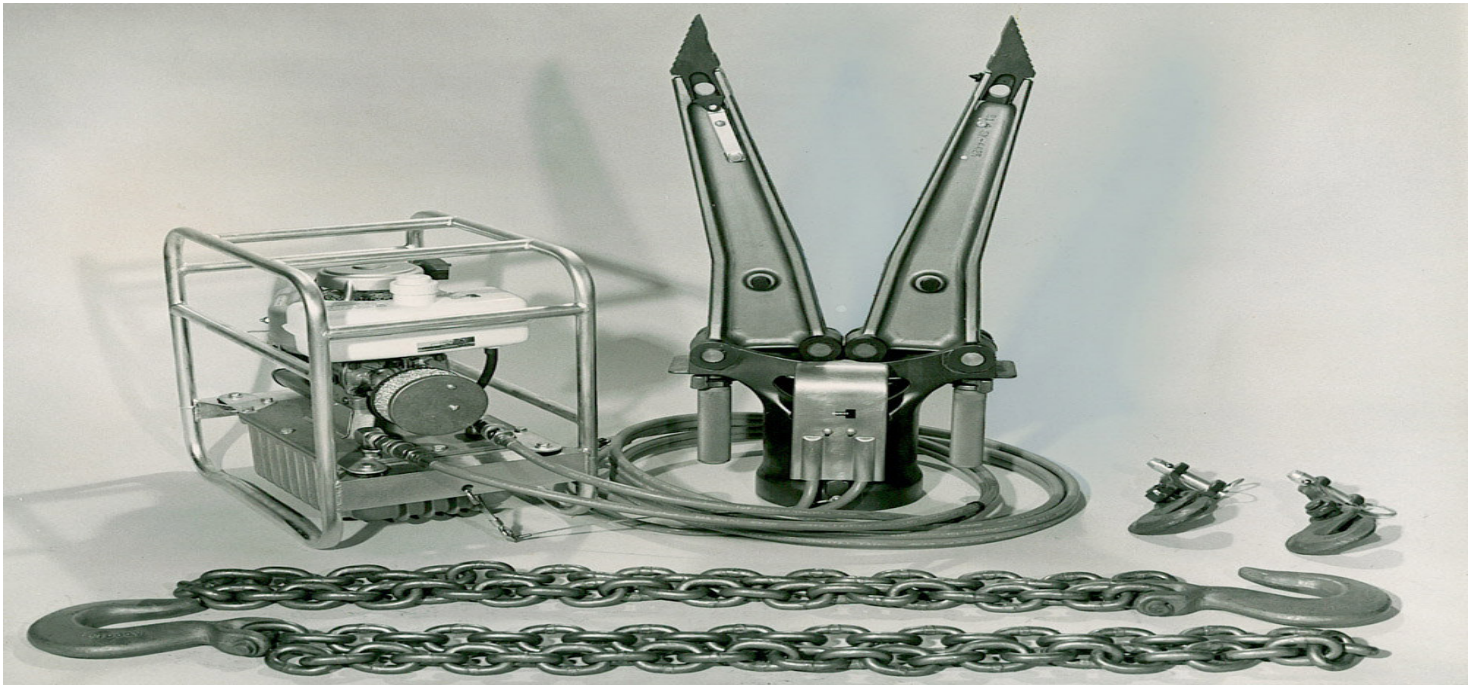
"The night I will never forget"

I was assigned to the rear middle tail board position because I was still classified as "The Rookie." Late that evening, we had just gone to bed, the 10 phone system alarm went off, the lights to the dorm came on and a man started to talk. "Engine 200, Engine 201, Rescue 200, C-1, Ambulance 310 respond to auto accident with entrapment." Upon arrival, we found a multiple car auto accident with two people heavily entrapped. Out came the HURST TOOL – **"JAWS OF LIFE"®** and cutters and in record time the cars were stabilized, both people were removed from the wreckage and transported to the area hospital even before the chief got on the scene.

Several months later a young woman came into the station to thank us for saving her life. However, her boy friend did not make the trip to the hospital. Here we are happy to see her alive, but sad to hear about her loss. This young lady wanted to see the new piece of equipment that saved her life. The family of the young man who died donated money towards the second HURST TOOL – **"JAWS OF LIFE"®**. This story is true and I played a small part in making this a reality.

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Old Jaws of Life Picture Original Photo - Then



The original tool was a two-part system consisting of a 32-inch hydraulic spreader powered by a two cycle gasoline power unit. When activated, the scissor-like spreaders opened and forced crushed metal away from trapped victims. Because the tool reduced the time to extricate a victim from a car crash, literally snatching them from the "jaws of death", the tool earned the name Jaws of Life. Today, Jaws of Life is a registered trademark of Hale Products Inc.

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Creating the Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Round Table

We will identify Governor's Mobile Tactical Command

1. The first meeting is in **Orlando, Florida on July 21 – 22, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will create a task force of experts to form a round table. The maximum number of experts from each state should not exceed two.

We will identify the impact of having Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters established in each region and will generate over **118 new jobs**

2. The second meeting is in **Atlanta, Georgia on August 25 – 26, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will have the necessary information to establish specific commands for each region and their location.

We will identify the topography and address special needs and how our equipment will be able to be shuttled by land, sea or air to the affective area of ground zero

3. The third meeting is in **Saint Louis Missouri, on September 22 and 23, 2007**, (RSVP) – We will finalize a list of all special equipment needed for each specific region.

The direction and scope of establishing Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters will be better identified and defined by the fourth meeting

4. The fourth meeting – is in **Washington D.C, on October 20 and 21, 2007**. We will invite specific Associations, Organizations, Special interested parties and private groups to help offset the cost of networking and to establish the first **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Headquarters**.

If each state pays their initial share by the fourth meeting and we generate **\$25,000,000.00** in donations from the private sector each state will only pay ONE MILLION DOLLARS THE NEXT YEAR (if the donation from the private sector continues). If we receive more donations then originally pledged, the states will off set-the cost difference the following years! By acting today, the first completed **Governor's Mobile Tactical Command Units** could be on-line by mid spring of 2008.

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The next newsletter will be about the S.M.E's, producing our own power for Governor's Command and neighboring areas and how our C-8500's are transformed into emergency response vehicles and support units.
